

Pine Cone Snowy Owl



Materials List

- Pine cone
- Black, yellow & white felt
- Googly eyes - large
- Cotton balls - about 15 per owl
- Tacky glue
- Black marker (optional)

Instructions:

1. Pull the cotton balls apart into smaller pieces before stuffing the pine cones. Pull them into 3-4 pieces each.
2. Poke the cotton in between the scales of the pine cone. Be careful the scales can be poky.
3. Cut out wings from the white felt. Optional - you can use a black marker to draw patterns on the wings if you would like more detail. Black markings on the wings can signify the age or gender of a snowy owl.
4. Cut out a beak from the black felt.
5. Cut out 2 circles from the yellow felt for the eyes. The yellow circles should be slightly larger than your googly eyes.
6. Glue googly eyes to the yellow felt circles.
7. Glue on eyes, beak, and wings to your pine cone. Remember...the cotton is not glued onto the pine cone, so if your eyes, beak, and wings are only glued to the cotton you can potentially pull it right out.
